PROPOSED OVERALL DBE TRIENNIAL GOAL 49 CFR PART 26

In accordance with 49 CFR part 26 and FTA Guidance, the City of Tucson sets forth its DBE triennial goal of 11% for all FTA-assisted contracts projected to be awarded in FFYs 2021-2023.

The DBE triennial goal was calculated utilizing the 6-digit NAICS codes to determine firms that would most likely bid on contracts as either a prime or a subcontractor for the anticipated FTA funds during this time period. The goal is based upon current analysis of ready, willing and able DBEs relative to all available ready, willing and able businesses in the relevant market area.

DBE TRIENNIAL GOAL METHODOLOGY

1. FTA-Assisted Contracts for FFY 2021 - 2023

Table 1 below provides a listing of FTA-assisted contracts projected to be awarded in FFYs 2021-2023.

2. Local Market Area

The local market area is the area in which the substantial majority of the contractors and subcontractors with whom the City of Tucson does business are located, and the area in which the City of Tucson spends the substantial majority of its contracting dollars. An analysis of the 7 FTA-assisted contracts completed between October 1, 2016 and September 30, 2019 revealed that 100% of those contracts were awarded to prime contractors located in Pima County. Therefore, the relevant market for City of Tucson federally funded projects would include the Pima County boundaries.

3. Methodology

Step One: Determine Weighted Base Figure

The City of Tucson followed the prescribed federal methodology to determine the base figure of the available DBE firms relative to all firms in the same work category (DBE and Non-DBE) that are ready, willing and able to bid on FTA-assisted contracts.

To establish the base figure, research was conducted to determine the firms available to perform the scopes of work detailed in each contract scheduled. This included businesses licensed by the Arizona Registrar of Contractors and businesses that bid on similar contracts during the last goal period. Certified DBEs were found using the Arizona Unified

Certification Program listing from the Arizona Department of Transportation, AZUTRAC website at https://utracs.azdot.gov/Search. To determine the "all ready, willing and able businesses in work category", the City of Tucson's Department of Procurement vendor database was utilized. A vendor report was created searching for all vendors registered under the NIGP Class Codes (1) 912 – Construction Services, General, (2) 913 – Construction, Heavy, (3) 914 – Construction Trades, (4) 906 – Architectural Services, Professional, (5) 925 – Engineering Services, Professional, (6) 570 – Metals: Fabrication, (7) 330 – Fencing, and (8) 968 – Traffic Control Services.

Relative Base Figure = Ready, willing and able DBEs in work category

All ready, willing and able businesses in work category

An initial Base Figure of **9.95** percent was calculated by dividing the total number of DBEs certified in all work categories (153) by the total number of available firms in all work categories (1,537) inherent in the contracts projected to be awarded with FTA funding.

$$9.95\% = \frac{153}{1,537}$$

To ensure that the Base Figure is as accurate as possible, the City then used the recommended methodology of weighting to determine the Rounded Weighted Base Figure by calculating the weight of each type of work by NAICS code (Table 3), calculating the relative availability of DBEs by NAICS code (Table 4) and calculating the rounded base figure (Table 5).

Therefore, the City's Rounded Weighted Base Figure of 11.00% accurately reflects where the dollars will be spent for the work to be performed.

Step Two: Adjusting the Base Figure

The City of Tucson examined the following criteria for possible Step 2 adjustment to the goal. The City managed a race-and -gender neutral program for the first time for the FY17-FY19 to establish contract goals for all FTA funded projects.

In accordance with regulatory guidance, the City of Tucson considered the following factors to determine if adjustment to the Weighted Base Figure was necessary to reflect other known factors in the relevant market area.

1. <u>Historical Participation of DBEs on FTA Assisted Contracts</u>: The City of Tucson conducted an analysis of the historical participation based upon the actual DBE Goal attained during FFYs 17 - 19. The DBE participation during this time period is summarized in Table 6.

The median DBE participation for this period was 58.11 percent adjusted to 0.00 percent after removing (2) two projects.

The City of Tucson compared the types of contracts completed during the FFYs 2018-2020 DBE Plan to the upcoming projects projected during the FYYs 2021-2023 DBE Plan. The exceedingly high DBE goal percentage attained in FFY 2017-2018 was due solely to having only (1) FTA-assisted contract completed for the fiscal year and it being awarded to a DBE prime contractor. The exceedingly high DBE goal percentage attained in FFY 2018-2019 was solely due to having only (1) FTA-assisted contract completed for the fiscal year and (1) one DBE subcontractor who performed the majority (77.67%) of the work which was for the replacement of a roof on the historic depot building. The scopes of work for these (2) projects are not similar to the projected contracts for FFY 2021-2023. Therefore, it is reasonable to remove these contracts from the median calculation rendering an adjusted 0.00% FTA DBE Goal Attainment Percentage for FFY 2017-2018 and 2018-2019. For these reasons, an adjustment was not made based upon historical participation, nor is there a relevant median to apply.

- 2. <u>DBE Prime Awarded FTA Assisted Contracts</u>: In FFY 2017-2018, (1) one certified DBE was awarded a contract as a Prime contractor; therefore, their participation would be counted as race neutral. Due to the availability of DBE firms as prime contractors, no adjustment was made for past participation.
- 3. <u>Bidders List</u>: The City of Tucson's bidder's lists from past procurements match the bidder's lists for the scopes of work in upcoming FTA-assisted contracts. The names of firms that showed interest in city procurement efforts were included in the calculations of base availability. Therefore, no adjustment was made based upon the bidder's list from past procurements.
- 4. <u>Disparity Study</u>: The City of Tucson does not have a current disparity study. The last disparity study conducted in Pima County was in 2008. The City of Tucson reviewed the disparity study conducted by the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) in 2020. However, it was determined that ADOT's disparity study was not applicable due to the

differences in the relative markets (State of Arizona vs Pima County) and the drastic difference in the type of FTA-assisted contracts. Therefore, no adjustment was made based upon ADOT's disparity study information.

Step Three: Calculate the Race- and Gender-Neutral and Race- and Gender-Conscious portion of the overall Goal

The City will achieve its triennial goal for FFYs 2021-2023 entirely through race- and gender-neutral measures. Because there is no current disparity study applicable to the City of Tucson, there is no factual predicate to justify race- and gender-conscious component.

Proposed Overall DBE Triennial Goal

The City of Tucson sets forth a DBE triennial goal of **11.00%** for all FTA funded contracts during FFYs 2021-2023. The triennial goal, which will be achieved through race-and gender-neutral measures, was established pursuant to 49 CFR Part 26.45 and FTA guidance. The goal is based upon current analysis of ready, willing and able DBEs relative to all ready, willing and able businesses in the relevant market area.

During the FFYs 2021-2023, the City of Tucson anticipates awarding the projects represented in Table 7 below:
